and Contributor iD

ORCID (Open Researcher and Contributor ID) aims to solve the name ambiguity problem in research by providing researchers with a free, permanent, unique identifier (your ORCID ID). ORCID also provides a linking mechanism between this and other current researcher ID schemes such as those in Scopus (Author ID) and Web of Science (ResearcherID) in order to correctly attribute your research activities and output in one place.

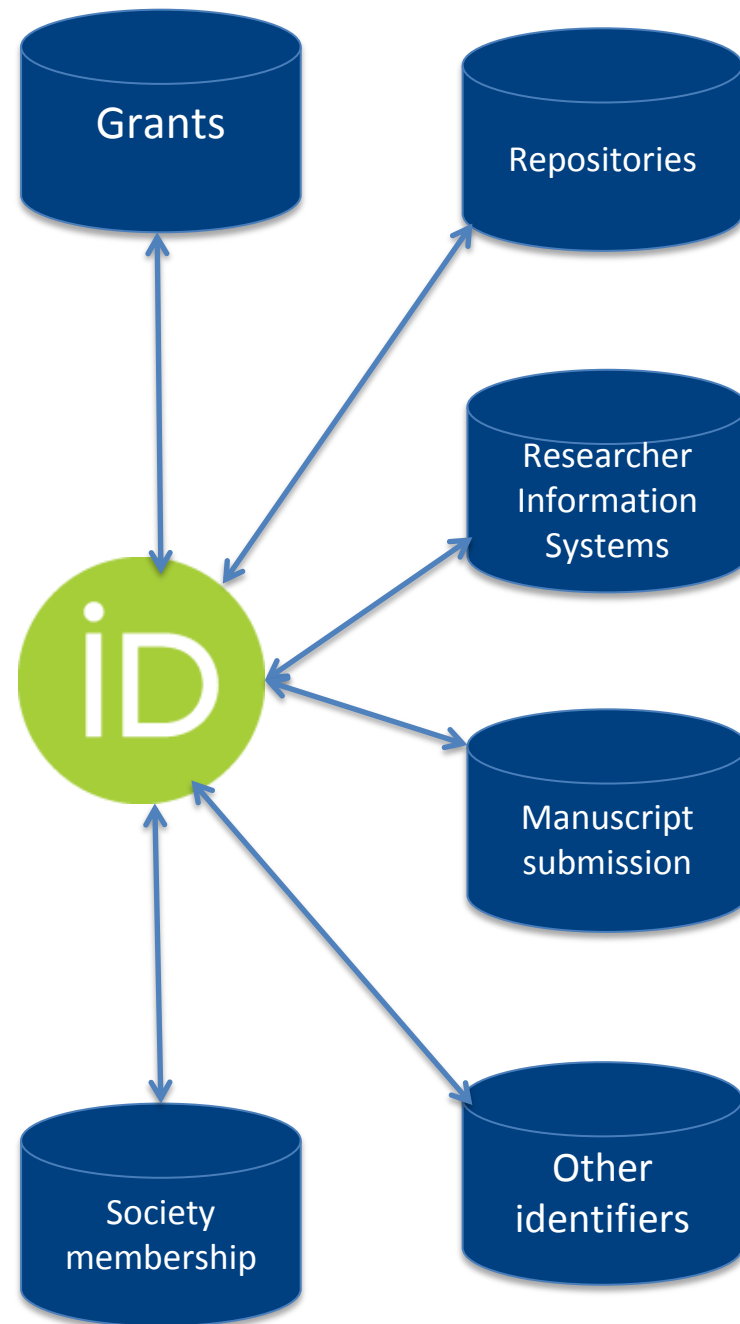

Linking Scopus data with ORCID

The Scopus/ORCID Wizard will transfer your Scopus Author ID information to your ORCID record. It allows you to merge several profiles into one preferred profile, add missing articles, or remove articles that were not authored by you. Go to your Author Details page in Scopus (search for your name in **Author Search** and click on the associated hyperlink) and click on **Add to ORCID**.

Click on **Authorise**.

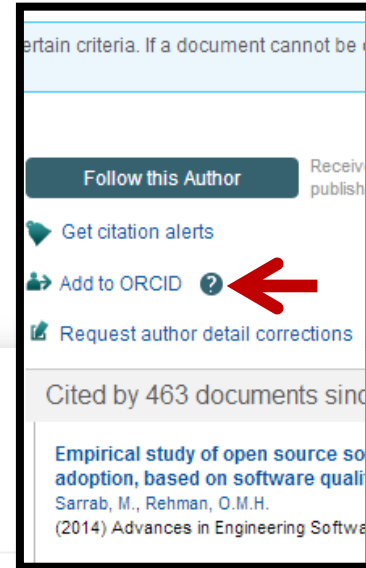

Scopus to ORCID

You can then import the identifier and list of publications into ORCID. Any changes you make will be submitted to the Feedback team to update your Scopus profile.
